We accept the following recyclables at the Site w/ Pitt Lake Collection Site Sticker in Window. <u>Appliances</u> – all appliances are \$5 except freon, which are \$15

<u>Automotive</u> – anti-freeze, batteries, motor oil and oil filters for free

Household – We no longer offer a Bin for clothing. Please take to Hope Gospel or trash. Fibers BIN – dry food boxes, corrugated containers, Newspaper, magazines, food cartons, (milk, juice, soy, soup). Freezer Cardboard, pop and beer boxes. No pizza boxes (except for top lid that is unsoiled). All fibers must be clean and dry.

Glass/Plastic/Metal BIN – aluminum and bimetal (steel + aluminum) cans. Empty Aerosol cans. Glass bottles and jars (containers like Pyrex and drinking glasses are not recyclable). Plastics #1, #2 and #5 containers and lids. Please flatten the bottles before putting caps back on. No window glass.

Lion's Club Plastic Bin – The bin takes grocery bags, bread bags, bubble wrap, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, ice bags, case overwrap, stretch film, wood pellet bags and product bags. There are containers for eye glasses, hearing aids, cell phones and Sharps. Pick up an empty sharp bin and return it full. Do not drop off loose sharps

<u>Medication</u> – All medications can be taken to the Dunn County Sheriff's Department at 615 Stokke Parkway, Menomonie, WI 54751 <u>Electronics</u> – All electronics can be taken to First Choice in Eau Claire 715-833-2005. Pitt Lake will accept for a **FEE**

Yard Waste: Pitt Lake will not accept any yard waste

Banned from disposal since 1991

- Lead acid batteries (automotive). Waste Oil

Banned from disposal since 1993

• Yard waste, including grass clippings, leaves, yard and garden debris, and brush under four inches in diameter

Banned from disposal since 1995

- Aluminum containers
- Corrugated paper or other container board
- Plastic contains #1 (PETE) and #2 (DHPE).
- Glass containers
- Magazines and other materials printed on similar paper.
- Newspapers and other materials printed on newsprint
- Office paper
- Steel containers
- Containers made form a combination of steel and aluminum (bi-metal cans).
- Waste tires

Banned from disposal since 2010

- Computers
- Desktop printers and printer/fax/copier/scanner combinations.
- Video display devices, including televisions, laptop computers and computer monitors.
- Oil filters and oil absorbents

Passes required. Pay with Taxes to Town of Weston or Town of Dunn Treasurer Due by 1/31/2024, There is a \$20 fee for replacement passes. If you do not live in the Town of Dunn or Town of Weston, please contact the Kevin Scholfield at 715-505-0293. <u>Passes stay with the home and not the person</u> when moving.

Hazardous Waste: Please contact WRR Environmental Services in Eau Claire, WI at 715-834-9624 **<u>REMEMBER</u>**: Ditch Trash is the responsibility of the whole town and all Ditch Trash expenses will go on next year's Dump pass

Batteries to be recycled – Automotive, alkaline manganese (rechargeable), lithium/lithium ion, nickel-cadmium and sealed lead acid for **free** with pass. Ask site attendant where the batteries should be disposed.

Batteries for Trash

-Button, alkaline (manganese), carbon zinc, zinc-air, silver oxide, and mercury oxide.

=Wisconsin has no legal requirements for disposing of household dry-cell batteries which include AAA, AA, A, B, C, D and 9-volt

-NOTE: Several department stores will take back used batteries at their photo department. Ask if yours does.

<u>-All non-recyclables (trash) can be brought to the Pitt</u> Lake site and disposed of for free with Pitt Lake <u>Collection Site Pass</u>

RECYCLING GUIDELINES

<u>Cardboard</u> – clean, free of debris and flattened. <u>Cans</u> – rinsed clean of product residue, well-drained, and recycled with plastics (not scrap metal). **Please remove food!**

<u>Glass</u> – only bottles and jars are recyclable. Rinse containers before recycling.

<u>Plastics</u> - #1, #2 and #5 containers and lids should be rinsed clean of product residue, well-drained and flattened. Place caps back on containers **AFTER** flattening

<u>**Paper**</u> – clean and free of non-paper items. Fridge and Freezer Containers accepted.
